Who is the Sanitarian?

A person with knowledge of the principles of physical, biological, and social sciences as applied to the improvement, control and management of man's environment. Included are aspects of public health to control the spread of disease and other health hazards, such as food contamination, air and water pollution, insect and rodent control, solid waste disposal, sewage disposal, and abatement of nuisances. A Sanitarian is also familiar with the science of cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and where necessary, sterilization

Credentials

- Competence in the science of Sanitation (Food Sanitarian, Health Officer, Food Inspector, Food Science or Health Instructor/educator, Environmental Health Specialists, Epidemiologist, Health Nurse, Physician)
- Competence in working as a consultant to a program, including strong verbal, writing and interpersonal skills
- Understanding of child care as a delivery system: variety of facilities, regulatory requirements, standards, and community resources to link with child care

Tasks

- Provide telephone advice to child care providers
- Perform on-site assessments of environment and operations
- Help develop policies and procedures on health and safety
- Help identify and work with a point person on health and safety in each child care facility, a "health advocate"
- Help caregivers obtain, understand, and use information to ensure the health of enrolled children
- Help caregivers obtain, understand and use job-related health information about child care staff
- Help caregivers accommodate children, family members and staff with special health needs in the child care setting
- Help families use a primary health clinician who will provide a "medical home" for their children
- Educate staff, families, and children about health issues and community resources
- Help implement child care operations and facility improvement plans
- Use licensing regulations, inspections and national standards to promote safe and healthy child care
